Expert on Vilhelm Moberg to speak at Chisago Lakes Library April 15



Mark your calendars! On Saturday, April 15, the Friends of the Karl Oskar House invite you to join them at the Chisago Lakes Area Library, 11754 302nd St., Chisago City, for their annual meeting where **Professor Roger McKnight will speak on "Vilhelm Moberg and Me. What the Swede taught me about Minnesota."**

The event begins with Fika (coffee and treats) and music by the Nya Duvemala Folkmusiklag at 9:30 a.m. McKnight will speak at 10 a.m. followed by the annual meeting showcasing highlights of the 2022 Karl Oskar House season. Additionally, the CLMS choir will be performing songs in Swedish.

McKnight, professor emeritus in Scandinavian studies at Gustavus Adolphus College in St Peter, has written extensively about Swedish novelist Vilhelm Moberg and Swedish-American social history and literature. A native of Illinois, McKnight first learned of Moberg while he was living in Sweden as a Fulbright scholar during the 1970s. After studying at Lund College in Sweden, McKnight completed graduate studies at the University of Minnesota before beginning his teaching career at Gustavus.

Moberg visited the Chisago Lakes area in the late 1940s while researching fictional characters Karl Oskar and Kristina for his novels The Emigrants, Unto a New Land, The Settlers and The Last Letter Home. The Karl Oskar House on Glader Blvd in Lindstrom was identified by Moberg while he was here and has been maintained by volunteers for over 26 years.

East Central Regional Arts Council Grant awarded to Friends of the Karl Oskar House

We received notice on February 28th that a grant we wrote in January has been approved for the Friends of the Karl Oskar House. The grant will allow us to build and install a kiosk near the entrance of the Karl Oskar House to allow visitors to learn about the history when the house is not attended. An artist will be engaged to create a mural depicting Karl Oskar and Kristina on the shed wall and the funds will go towards our summer musical programming. Additionally new chairs will be purchased for the concerts and inside use. We are very grateful for the opportunity to enhance our visitor's experience.

Visit from Södra Vätterbygdens Folkhögskola.

Sven, Marilyn W & Gary are leading a tour group from Sweden that Ann Moonen has previously brought to the Minnesota. On April 17 about 50 members of a choir from Södra Vätterbygdens Folkhögskola, Jönköping, Sweden, will visit the area including the Karl Oskar House.

Södra Vätterbygdens Folkhögskola (Svf) is a folk high school and is one of 150 schools for adult education known as "folkhögskola". This is a form of adult education, called "folkbildning", that is typical for Scandinavia.

Participation is elective and the education free from government influence. Like the majority of these schools, Svf is owned by an organisation, in this case the Uniting Church in Sweden. Svf was founded in 1919.
